#### **SNOW REMOVAL NOTICE**

The City will be implementing the winter parking rule. The rule suspends ordinance #9.1410 Stopping-Parking-over 48 hrs. and in-states ordinance #3.0214 Street Cleaning-snow removal suspension rule. The ordinance now states that there will be <u>no parking on City Streets during daylight hours</u> (except for Main Street) to allow for proper snow removal.

Please remove all vehicles, boats, trailers and campers from City Streets. Penalty can be fines up to \$500. <u>If snow is predicted</u> and you have a vehicle on the street overnight that is removed daily, make sure it is removed before the plow gets to your street.

#### Winter Survival Hints

To prevent frostbite on exposed skin, such as the face, lather with Vaseline or baby oil.

In a pinch, you can use a jar of Crisco as a candle by simply inserting a wick into the oil.

If you need to use a bicycle as transportation you can improve the grip on the tires by placing zip ties at regular intervals around the tire.
