RECREATIONAL FIRES

Recreational fires are allowed in covered containers equipped with screens and spark arrestors, **weather permitting**. Please make sure there is **no burn ban or red flag warning by going online to ND burn ban maps or see our website under Featured news**.

Containers shall NOT be placed within 15 feet of structures or combustible material.

Please **do not** blow grass clippings into the streets when mowing! This plugs the curbs for rain/water flow and is a breeding spot for mosquitoes. Thank you!

Reminder for reasonable measures to reduce the risk of starting a wildfire

- Check the current fire danger and expected weather conditions and follow local burn bans at NDResponse.gov/burn
- Always stay off dry grass when driving a vehicle as hot exhaust pipes and be a heat source for starting a fire.
- Double check to ensure chains do not drag as you tow
- Property dispose of cigarettes.

CLEAN UP TIME

We are asking that residents please clean up their yards and remove any old un-running, non-licensed vehicles from their yards. They are becoming an eye-sore for your neighbors and the community.

Any other equipment, such as lawn mowers, BBQ grills, bicycles and appliances that do not run (refrigerators, stoves, water heaters) can be taken out to Earth Recycling located NE of Glenburn.

Grass must be mowed on a regular basis, anything taller than eight inches must be cut down.
