Ordinance Changes

The council has changed the Animal and Fowl ordinance Chapter Eleven. You can find the updated version on the website, address provided on the upper right corner of this page. This takes effect after the second reading after the June 2nd meeting.

Other changes include: The increase of the connection fee to two hundred dollars (\$200.00) when new occupants move in. The late fee for not licensing dogs by March 1st, will go up to one hundred dollars (\$100.00) These increases take place on June 1st.

RECREATIONAL FIRES

Recreational fires are allowed in covered containers equipped with screens and spark arrestors, weath permitting. Please make sure there no burn ban or red flag warning be going online to ND burn ban maps see our website under Featured news.

Containers shall NOT be placed with 15 feet of structures or combustib material.

CLEAN UP TIME

We are asking that residents please clean up their yards and remove any old un-running, non-license vehicles from their yards. They are becoming an eysore for your neighbors and the community. Any other equipment, such as lawn mowers, BBC grills, bicycles and appliances that do not run (refrigerators, stoves, water heaters) can be take out to Earth Recycling located NE of Glenburn. Grass must be mowed on a regular basis, anythin
